





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# 1. THE UNIVERSITY

## 1.1 Introduction

The Indira Gandhi National Open University was established by an Act of Parliament in 1985 to achieve the following objectives:

- ☐ democratising higher education by taking it to the doorsteps of the learners,
- ☐ providing access to high quality education to all those who seek it irrespective of age, region, religion and gender,
- ☐ offering need-based academic programmes by giving professional and vocational orientation to the courses, and
- ☐ promoting and developing distance education in India.

## 1.2 Prominent Features

## 1.4 The Schools of Studies

With a view to develop interdisciplinary programmes, the University operates through its Schools of Studies. Each School is headed by a Director who arranges to organise its academic programmes and courses in coordination with the School faculty and staff, and different academic, administrative and service divisions of the University. ### 1.5 Academic Programmes

The University offers Certificates, Diplomas, Advance Diplomas, Post Graduate Diplomas and Degrees, which are conventional as well as innovative. Most of these programmes have been developed after an initial survey of the need for such programmes. They are launched with a view to fulfilling the learners' needs for:

- ▣ certification,
- ▣ improvement of skills,
- ▣ acquisition of professional qualifications,
- ▣ continuing education and professional development at workplace,
- ▣ self-enrichment,
- ▣ diversification and updating of knowledge, and
- ▣ empowerment.

### 1.6 Course Preparation

Learning material is specially prepared by teams of experts drawn from different universities and specialized institutions in the area spread throughout the country as well as in-house faculty. The material is scrutinized by the content experts, in-house faculty and edited by the language experts at IGNOU before these are finally sent for printing. Similarly, audio and video materials are produced in consultation with the course writers, in-house faculty and producers. The material is previewed and reviewed by the faculty as well as outside experts and edited/modified, wherever necessary, before they are finally dispatched to the students, Learner Support Centres and Telecast through Gyan Darshan.

### 1.7 Credit System

#### a) Defining Credit in ODL

The University follows the 'Credit System' for most of its programmes. Each credit in our system is equivalent to 30 hours of learner study comprising all learning activities (i.e., reading and comprehending the print material, listening to audio, watching video, attending counselling sessions, teleconference and writing assignment responses). Thus, a 4-credit course involves 120 hours of study and a 6-credit course involves 180 hours of study. This helps the learner to know the academic effort he/she has to put in, to successfully complete a course. Completion of an academic programme (Degree or Diploma) requires successful completion of the assignments, practical, projects and the Term-End Examination as per requirement of each course in a programme.

#### b) Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

The Bachelor's Degree Programmes offered through this prospectus follow the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) introduced by UGC. The CBCS provides the learner with flexibility to study the subjects/courses at their own pace; greater choice of inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary and skill-based

courses; and mobility to different institutions for studies. The system has the following advantages:

- ▣ Allows learners to choose a combination of inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary courses, skill oriented courses (even from other disciplines according to their learning needs, interests and aptitude).
- ▣ Makes education broad-based and at par with global standards.
- ▣ Offers flexibility for learners to study at different times and at different institutions to complete the programme. Credits earned at one institution can be transferred to another institution.

## 1.8 Support Services

In order to provide individualized support to its learners, the University has a large number of Learner Support Centres, spread across the country. These Learner Support Centres are coordinated by 67 Regional Centres and Recognised Regional Centres. At the Learner Support Centres, the learners interact with the Academic Counselors and other learners, refer to books in the Library, watch/listen to video/audio programmes and interact with the Coordinator on administrative and academic matters. The list of Regional Centres is given in this Prospectus. Support services are also provided through Work Centres, Programme Learner Support Centres, Skill Development Centres and Special Learner Support Centres.

**In case the number of students enrolled in a program is small, the University shall provide Technology Enabled Learner Support (TELS) through Gyan Darshan / Gyan Vani / Swayam Prabha/ Web based support.**

## 1.9 Programme Delivery

The methodology of instruction in this University is different from that of the conventional Universities. The Open University system is more learner-oriented and the learner is an active participant in the pedagogical (teaching and learning) process. Most of the instructions are imparted through distance education methodology as per the requirement.

The University follows a multimedia approach for instruction, which comprises:

- a) Self Instructional Printed Material:** The printed study material (written in self-instructional style) for both theory and practical components of the programmes is provided to the learners in the form of a single print book and/or e-book, comprising blocks and units or in the form of separate printed blocks for every course (on an average 1 block per credit). A block which comes in the form of a booklet usually comprises 3 to 5 units.

**Audio-Visual Material Aids:** The learning package contains audio and video programmes which have been produced by the University for better clarification and enhancement of understanding of the course material given to the learners. A video programme is normally of 25-30 minutes duration.

- b)** The Video content is available on eGyan Kosh ([www.egyankosh.ac.in](http://www.egyankosh.ac.in)) – the digital learning repository of the University.

**The video programmes are also telecast on National Network of Gyan Darshan and Swayamprabha channels. All Gyan Vani stations broadcast curriculum-based audio programmes as per their schedule that is notified in advance. In addition, some selected stations of All India Radio also broadcast the audio programmes. Learners can confirm the dates for the programmes from their Learner Support Centres. The information is also provided through the university website.**

- c) Counselling Sessions:** Normally counselling sessions are held as per schedule drawn by the Learner Support Centres. These are mostly held outside the regular working hours of the host institutions where the Learner Support Centres are located. **However, in case the number of students in a programme is small, face-to-face counselling shall not be organized. In such cases the University shall provide Web Enabled Academic Support to the learners.**
- d) Tele conferences:** Live sessions are conducted via satellite through interactive Gyan Darshan Channel as well as simultaneously webcast at <http://ignouonline.ac.in/> and via Facebook Live sessions.
- e) Practicals/Project Work:** Some Programmes have practical/project component also depending upon the learning requirements. Practical sessions are held at designated institutions for which schedule is provided by the Learner Support Centres. Attendance at practical sessions is compulsory. For project work, comprehensive project guide, in the form of a booklet, is provided to the learner along with the study

material.

## 1.10 Web Enabled Academic Support (WEAS)

To provide technology based academic support to the learners of the distance mode programmes, IGNOU has initiated a scheme of Web Enabled Academic Support (WEAS) for various ODL programmes of IGNOU. WEAS is a Single Window Platform providing various kinds of academic support including the study material, audio-video, quiz, discussion forum, calendar of activities, web-based video counselling, links of various web-based resources to the distance learners by using simple and easily available ICT tools. The students enrolled in programmes being offered through WEAS are given access to their programme specific portal in which they are provided with course material in digital format, video and learning resources. The portal enables online peer-to-peer interaction and discussion, it also gives an opportunity to the students to learn online and interact virtually with teachers and experts. ## 1.11 Evaluation System

The system of evaluation followed by the University also is different from that of conventional universities. IGNOU has a multitier system of evaluation.

1. Self-assessment exercises within each unit of study material.
2. Continuous evaluation mainly through assignments which are tutor-marked, practical assignments and seminar/ workshops/extended contact programmes, etc.
3. Term-End Examinations (TEE).
4. Project / Term-end Practical examination.

The evaluation of learners depends upon various instructional activities undertaken by them. A learner has to write assignment responses compulsorily before taking Term-End Examinations from time to time to complete an academic programme. A learner has to submit Tutor Marked Assignments (TMA) responses to the Coordinator of the Learner Support Centre to which s/he is attached. **Term-end examination is conducted at various examination centres spread all over the country and abroad in June and December every year.**

IGNOU uses the following system of "Grading" for evaluating learners' achievement

For Bachelors' and Masters' degree programmes, normally the system of numerical marking is followed, and the marks secured in assignments, TE Exams, etc. are later converted into grades as per the five-point grading scale given above. However, if required by the learner, the university provides numerical marks and division (I, II or Pass).

IGNOU uses 10-Point Grading System for evaluating learners' achievement for Bachelor Degree Programmes under CBCS, as under:

#### Term-End Examination and Payment of Examination Fee

The University conducts Term-end Examination (TEE) twice a year in the months of June & December. A learner is permitted to appear in TEE subject to the following conditions: -

1. Registration for the courses is valid and not time barred.
2. Required number of assignments in the courses have been submitted by due date wherever applicable.
3. Minimum time to pursue these courses as per the provision of the programme has been completed.
4. Examination fee for all the courses the learner is appearing in the examination has been paid.

In the case of non-compliance of any of the above conditions, the result of all such courses is liable to be with held by the University.

#### Term-end Examination

The learners are required to fill in the Examination form to appear in the TEE each time i.e., for every exam (June/ December) a learner has to apply afresh. The Examination Forms are accepted online only as per the schedule given below.

Examination fee once paid is neither refundable nor adjustable even if the learner fails to appear in the examination.

### Hall Ticket for Term End Examination

No hall ticket shall be dispatched to the examinees. Hall Tickets of all examinees are uploaded on the University Website ([www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in)) 7-10 days before the commencement of the Term End Examinations. Therefore, learners are advised to visit IGNOU website for updates.

Students are advised to take the print out of the Hall Ticket from University website after entering the enrolment number and name of programme of study, and report at the examination centre along with the Identity Card issued by the University. Without a valid IGNOU Student ID Card issued by the University, examinees will not be permitted to appear in the examination.

In case, any learner has misplaced the Identify Card issued by the University, it is mandatory to apply for a duplicate Identity Card to the Regional Centre concerned well before commencement of the examinations so as to get a duplicate ID Card in time. Learners without valid ID Card will not be allowed to enter the Examination Centre premises. Students who have taken admission online can download their ID Card online.

### 1.12 International Students Residing in India

The foreign nationals are advised to visit the page of International Division of the University (<http://ignou.ac.in/ignou/aboutignou/division/id/introduction> ) for the programmes on offer for them; programme fee and other fees applicable for them. They may also contact International Division of the University at the Headquarters for more details.

### 1.13 Online Admission System

The Admission Forms can be submitted online (except for International Students) through Online Admission System at <http://onlineadmission.ignou.ac.in>. Currently, the facility is available for the programmes offered through Common Prospectus except merit-based and entrance test based programmes. The prospective learners are required to create their user ID and password for logging in the system and upload the required documents along with the submission of the Admission Form. There is no need to send the printed copy of the Admission Form to the Regional Centre. The programme fee can be paid online using payment Gateway through net banking, debit/credit card or UPI. Once the admission form is submitted online, the students can track the progress of their admission. A message is sent on the mobile number and email ID registered with the System once admission is confirmed. In case of any discrepancy in the Admission Form, the prospective students are advised to remove the discrepancy within a stipulated time. Failing to do so will lead to rejection of admission form.

The prospective learners submitting the Admission Form through this System can download the Prospectus free from IGNOU website <http://www.ignou.ac.in>. However, an amount of **Rs.200/- is charged** as registration fee along with the programme fee.

### 1.14 eGyan Kosh

The IGNOU eGyan Kosh (<http://egyankosh.ac.in/>) one of the world's largest repositories of educational resources in higher education-is available for the learners and teachers, and public at large for free. The eGyan Kosh currently houses the self-learning material of over 2500 courses and an equal number of video programmes of IGNOU. The IGNOU learners are encouraged to make use of these resources for their learning.

### 1.15 IGNOU e-Content Mobile App

IGNOU-e-Content Mobile App is an official mobile app of Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), New Delhi. This app is an ICT initiative of IGNOU to provide Digital Learning Environment to IGNOU learners and extending Technology Enhanced Learner Support Services to them. The aim of this initiative is to disseminate the digitised course material to IGNOU Learners. IGNOU learners can use this app to access their course material through their hand held devices such as Mobile Phones and Tablets.

### 1.16 Vidya Lakshmi Portal

Vidya Lakshmi Portal is a first of its kind portal for students seeking Education Loan. Set up in August 2015, it is a single window electronic platform for students to access information and prepare applications for Educational Loans and Government Scholarships. The Portal has the facility of tracking the students right from the inception of loan application until the completion of sanction of loan or otherwise. Students can view, apply and track their education loan applications to banks anytime, anywhere through the Portal. The portal has been developed and being maintained by NSDL e-Governance Infrastructure Limited.

Nearly 40 Banks have registered for over **70 Educational Loan Schemes** on the Vidya Lakshmi Portal and integrated their system with the Portal for providing loan processing status to students.

## 1.17 Course-wise Registration and Certification Scheme (CRCS)

The University offers a scheme of Course-wise Registration and Certification (CRCS). Under this scheme, one can register for a single course or a limited number of courses, subject to a maximum of 16 credits. The rules of CRCS are as under:

1. The eligibility for registering for a course under the Scheme shall be same as the eligibility for admission to the Programme from where the course(s) are drawn.
2. The Scheme shall be offered in both Cycles of Admission, subject to the provision that the courses are on offer in the particular admission cycle.
3. Registration for all courses of all the academic programmes shall be open for registration under the Scheme except the courses offered under Research Degree Programmes and Awareness/Appreciation level Programmes.
4. Courses offered in combination shall have to be taken together by the student.
5. Course(s) once opted shall not be changed or withdrawn by the student.
6. The minimum and maximum period allowed for completion of the course(s) registered would be six months and two years, respectively.
7. There will be no separate counselling or lab-work schedule for students registered under the Scheme. The registered students under the Scheme shall be advised to be in touch with the Learner Support Centre allocated in order to know the schedule of theory/practical counselling sessions and participate in the sessions accordingly.
8. Candidates registering under the Scheme, for successfully completing the course(s) opted, shall be required to fulfill all the academic requirements as prescribed by the University from time to time.
9. Candidates successfully completing the course(s) opted shall be provided with a Certificate of Completion of Course indicating the score obtained in continuous/term-end assessment and credits earned.
10. The fee chargeable under the Scheme shall be as under:

Credit weightage of each course	Course Fee
Up to 4 credits	Rs.1000/-
Above 4 credits	Rs.2000/-

The fee shall be calculated per course and not on the basis of total number of credits taken. The Course Fee shall be subject to revision and shall be linked with the revision of Programme fee. In addition to the course fee, Registration fee as decided by the University from time to time shall be chargeable. Fee once paid shall be non-refundable or non-adjustable. Examination fee, as notified by the University from time to time, shall be charged over and above the course fee and registration fee.

11. Candidates shall be allowed to seek transfer of credits earned under the Scheme by taking admission in a Programme of IGNOU subject to the following conditions:
  - a. Fulfillment of all the conditions as notified by the University from time to time for that particular academic programme.
  - b. A maximum of 50% of the credits earned under the Scheme shall be allowed at the time of taking admission in the relevant programme.

- c. Credits earned for Project or Internship shall not be transferred.
- d. Transfer of credits earned under the Scheme for an academic programme that falls under the purview of a Regulatory Authority shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the concerned Regulatory Authority.
- e. Credit transfer of a course shall be permitted on application with requisite fee after taking admission in a programme.
- f. Credit transfer shall be given only in the courses offered in that programme. In case the completed course under the Scheme is revised, credit transfer shall not be permitted.
- g. Transfer of credits earned under the Scheme to an academic programme offered by the University in collaboration/under MoU with other Institutions, shall be governed by the terms of collaboration/MoU.
- h. The UGC framework for Credit Transfer shall be applicable for transfer of credits.
- i. Application for CRCS can be made online on the Online Admission Portal of the University.

The University offers Bachelor of Arts Degree with the following Disciplines:

**Objectives:** The Bachelors of Arts programme is a broad based programme with a mix of disciplinary, interdisciplinary and skill based courses. It has the following objectives:

1. Introduce the learners to the main themes and topics of disciplines in humanities, social sciences and sciences,
2. Provide the learners with the information and skills necessary to understand and analyse their world,
3. Enable the learners to work towards ability and skill enhancement through exposure to appropriate courses.
4. Impart reading and writing skills through assignments and exercises of such kind at an undergraduate level.
5. Expose the learner to the importance of interdisciplinarity.

**Eligibility:** 10+2 or its equivalent

**Medium of Instruction:** English & Hindi

**Duration:** Minimum 3 years and Maximum 6 years; offered in both January and July cycle of admission.

**Fee Structure:** For B.A. Rs. 10,500/- for full programme to be paid year wise @ Rs. 3,500/- per year. Fee to be paid in 1st year, including Registration Fee of Rs.200/- is Rs.3,700/-

Learners opting B.A. Psychology courses with Practicum component are required to pay an extra fee of Rs.600/- in each year.

The University follows the credit system for offering all its programmes. One credit is equal to 30 hours of learners study time. To earn Bachelor's Degree, a learner has to complete 132 credits in minimum six semesters

(Three years) with 22 credits per semester. The 132 credits of the programme have to be earned by completing the following categories of courses:

- a) Core Courses (CC)

- b) Discipline Specific Electives (DSE)
- c) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)
- d) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)
- e) Generic Electives (GE)

A learner can choose any two disciplines from the above thirteen disciplines for completing BA programme. Once the two disciplines are chosen in the first semester, he/she has to take Core Courses and Discipline Specific Elective Courses from those two Disciplines ONLY in all the subsequent semesters as per the following Programme StructureTemplate:

As per CBCS, in disciplines such as Botany, Chemistry, Geology, Physics and Zoology, where Laboratory work is compulsory, a 06 Credit Course is offered as a combination of two Courses in the same subject area: a 04 Credits Theory Course and a 02 Credits Laboratory Course. Both these courses in a given subject area of a discipline are to be taken together compulsorily.

The people working in the tourism sector, self-employed, other adults who wish to upgrade their educational qualification and knowledge in the tourism sector will be benefitted with this programme. The programme will provide University level education in new fields of knowledge and niche areas which fulfil the demands of employment and economy of the country.

**Eligibility:** 10+2 or its equivalent

**Medium of Instruction:** English and Hindi

**Duration:** Minimum 3 years, Maximum 6 years; offered in both January and July cycle of admission.

**Fee Structure:** Rs. 12600/- for full programme to be paid Rs.4200/- per year

The B.A. (Voc) Tourism Management Programme is of 132 credits spread over six semesters (Three years) with study load worth 22 credits in each semester. ### Bachelor of Arts (Honours) Degree Programmes School of Social Sciences (SOSS)

The School of Social Sciences offers Bachelor of Arts (Honours) Degree Programme in the following Disciplines:

- 1) Economics
- 2) History
- 3) Political science
- 4) Psychology
- 5) Public administration
- 6) Sociology

**Objectives:** With a substantial number of courses drawn from a single discipline, and a few interdisciplinary and skill-based elective courses, the Bachelors Honours programmes are designed to give an in-depth knowledge in a discipline while allowing for exposure to subjects beyond the discipline. The Honours programmes have the following objectives:

1. Introduce the learner to the main themes and topics in a discipline of humanities, social sciences and sciences with core and elective courses.
2. Facilitate the learners to work towards ability and skill enhancement through exposure to appropriate courses.
3. Introduce learners to reading and writing skills through assignments and exercises of such kind at an undergraduate level.
4. Expose the learners to the importance of interdisciplinary by enabling them to offer courses outside their disciplines.

**Eligibility:** 10+2 or its equivalent

**Medium of Instruction:** English and Hindi

**Duration:** Minimum 3 Years, Maximum 6 Years; offered in both January and July cycle of admission.

**Fee Structure:** Rs. 11,700/- for full programme to be paid year wise @ Rs. 3,900/- per year. Fee to be paid in 1st year, including Registration Fee of Rs.200/- is Rs.4,100/

**Learners opting B.A. Psychology Honours programme are required to pay an additional fee of Rs.600/-per year.**

To earn BA (Honours) Degree in a Discipline, a learner has to complete courses worth 148 credits in minimum six semesters (three years). The Honours programmes have a mix of following categories of courses:

- a) Core Courses (CC)
- b) Discipline Specific Electives (DSE)
- c) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)
- d) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)
- e) Generic Electives (GE)

The University follows the credit system for offering all its programmes. One credit is equal to 30 hours of learners study time. To earn Bachelor's Honours Degree, a learner has to complete 148 credits in minimum six semesters. The study load of the Honours programmes vary from semester to semester. Students have to complete 22 credits each in first and second semesters; 28 credits each in third and fourth semesters; and 24 credits each in fifth and sixth semesters. The distribution of different types of courses across the six semesters and their credit weightage is given in the Programme Structure Template below:

### 3.9 Bachelor of Arts English (Honours)(BAEGH) School of Humanities (SOH)

The University offers a Bachelor's Honours Degree Programme in English (**BAEGH**) in addition to a number of other disciplines. Information pertaining to the Programme is given below:

**Objectives (BAEGH):** With a substantial number of courses drawn from a single discipline (English), and a few interdisciplinary and skill-based elective courses, the Bachelors Honours programme (English) is designed to give an in-depth knowledge in that discipline while allowing for exposure to subjects beyond the discipline as well. The Honours programme has the following general objectives:

1. To introduce the learner to main themes and topics in the discipline of English through core, discipline-centric electives, ability/skill enhancement and generic courses.
2. To facilitate the learners to work towards ability and skill enhancement through exposure to appropriate courses in humanities and social sciences.
3. Introduce learners to reading and writing skills through assignments and exercises at an undergraduate level.
4. Expose the learners to the importance of interdisciplinary study by enabling them to offer courses outside their disciplines.

**Eligibility:** 10+2 or its equivalent

**Medium of Instruction:** English

**Duration:** Minimum 3 years and Maximum 6 years; offered in both January and July cycle of admission.

**Fee Structure:** A total of Rs. 11,700/- is to be paid year-wise for the full programme, @ Rs.3,900/- year. Fee to be paid in the first year including a registration fee of 200/- is Rs. 4,100/-.

The University follows the credit system for offering all its programmes. One credit is equal to 30 hours of learners' study time. To earn BA (Honours) Degree in a discipline, a learner has to complete courses worth 148 credits in a minimum of six semesters (three years). The students have to complete 22 credits each in first and second semesters; 28 credits each in third and fourth semesters; and 24 credits each in fifth and sixth semesters.

The Honours programmes have a mix of courses. For earning 148 credits, a student has to study the following categories of courses:

- a) Core Courses (**CC**)
- b) Discipline Specific Electives (**DSE**)
- c) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (**AECC**)
- d) Skill Enhancement Courses (**SEC**)
- e) Generic Electives (**GE**)

A learner can choose BA Honours programme in any **ONE** of the following Disciplines: Economics, English, Hindi, History, Political Science, Psychology, Public Administration, and Sociology. The study load of the Honours programmes varies from semester to semester. Once the Discipline is chosen, the learner has to take the courses under categories (a) Core Courses and (b) Discipline Specific Elective Courses from that Discipline **ONLY** in all the semesters.

#### **Core Courses (CC)**

The programme has 14 core courses. Each core course is of six credits. These courses cover more than half of the programme, 84 credits (14 courses x 6 credits) out of 148 credits of the programme.

#### **Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSE)**

Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSEs) are on offer in the fifth and sixth semesters of the programme. The 4 DSEs are specific (or specialized or advanced or supportive) to the discipline or subject of study and provide an extended scope. They are of 6 credits each (6 courses x 4 credits) and will thus be 24 credits in all.

### Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses are of four credits each. As the name suggests, the Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECCs) are compulsory for all learners. There are two AECCs on offer, one each in the first and second semesters. With one course in the first two semesters each, (2 courses x 4 credits), the AECC courses will add up to 8 credits in all.

### Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) are also ability enhancement courses. These are value-based and/or skill-based courses and are designed to develop competencies and skills. Each Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) is of four credits. These courses are on offer in the third and fourth semesters. One SEC in each semester (2 courses x 4 credits) will add up to 8 credits.

### Generic Electives (GE)

Generic Electives (GEs) are the other type of electives that are on offer in the first, second, third and fourth semesters of the programme and are of 6 credits each. These courses are inter-disciplinary in nature and provide an exposure to other disciplines/subjects. With one course in each of the first four semesters, (4 courses x 6 credits), GE will come to 24 credits in all.

## SEMESTER-WISE COURSE OPTIONS

In each semester, the students have to study four 4 courses in all from different categories of courses except in the third and fourth semesters when the number of courses goes up to 5. While the courses under CC, DSE and GE Categories are of 6 credits each, the courses under AECC and SEC are of 4 credits each. While the fourteen CCs are distributed across the six semesters, the four DSEs are available in the fifth and sixth semesters only. There will be a number of SECs and the GEs available in the common pool in each of the semesters in which they are offered. A student has to opt for only one GE for study in each of the first four semesters and one SEC during the third and fourth semesters of the programme. The university will be adding new SECs and electives (DSEs and GEs) to the existing pool of courses from time to time. The study load in the first and second semesters will be 22 credits each and while the credit load in the third and fourth semesters will be enhanced to 28 credits each, it will come down to 24 credits each in the fifth and sixth semesters. Thus the total study load will come to 148 credits. The following Table presents the **CODES** and **TITLES** of credit load and semester-wise courses available for BA Honours (English):

### 3.10 स्नातक उपाधि (ऑनर्स) हिंदी (बीएचडीएच)

#### मानविकी विद्यापीठ (एसओएच)

विश्वविद्यालय अन्य विषयों के अलावा हिंदी (बीएचडीएच) में एक ऑनर्स उपाधि कार्यक्रम प्रदान करता है। कार्यक्रम से संबंधित जानकारी नीचे दी गई है:

#### उद्देश्य:

स्नातक उपाधि (ऑनर्स) हिंदी : बी.ए.( हिंदी) ऑनर्स कार्यक्रम एक व्यापक कार्यक्रम है। इसका कोड बी.ए.एच.डी.एच.(BAHDH) है। यह कार्यक्रम हिंदी विषय के गहन अध्ययन पर आधारित कार्यक्रम है जिसमें हिंदी के अतिरिक्त अन्य विषयों का अध्ययन भी प्रस्तावित है। इस कार्यक्रम में विभिन्न विद्यापीठों से अध्ययन के कई विषय और पाठ्यक्रम शामिल हैं। एक एकल अनुशासन (हिंदी) कुछ अंतरानुशासनात्मक और कौशल आधारित वैकल्पिक पाठ्यक्रमों से तैयार किये गए पाठ्यक्रमों की पर्याप्त संख्या के साथ स्नातक उपाधि ऑनर्स ( हिंदी) को उस विशिष्ट अनुशासन (हिंदी) में गहन ज्ञान देने के लिए तैयार किया गया है। ऑनर्स कार्यक्रम के निम्नलिखित सामान्य उद्देश्य हैं:

1 मुख्य विषय, अनुशासन केंद्रित ऐच्छिक, क्षमता/कौशलवृद्धि और सामान्य पाठ्यक्रमों के माध्यम से हिंदी के अनुशासन में मुख्य विषयों और विषयों के लिए शिक्षार्थी का परिचय कराना।

2 मानव और सामाजिक विज्ञान में उपयुक्त पाठ्यक्रमों के लिए जोखिम के माध्यम से क्षमता और कौशल वृद्धि की दिशा में काम करने के लिए शिक्षार्थियों की सुविधा के लिए।

3 स्नातक स्तर पर सत्रीय कार्य और अभ्यास के माध्यम से शिक्षार्थियों को पढ़ने और लिखने के कौशल से परिचित कराना।

4 शिक्षार्थियों को विषय के अतिरिक्त अन्य विषयों के अध्ययन की ओर प्रेरित कर के अन्तः विषयी अध्ययन के महत्त्व में प्रेरित करना।

**पात्रता:** 10+2 या समकक्ष

**शिक्षाकामाध्यम:** हिंदी

**अवधि:** न्यूनतम 3 वर्ष और अधिकतम 6 वर्ष, जनवरी और जुलाई दोनों प्रवेश सत्रों में उपलब्ध।

**शुल्कसंरचना:** रु 10,700/- पूरे कार्यक्रम के लिए, रु 3,900/- प्रतिवर्ष। रु 200/- के पंजीकरण शुल्क सहित पहले वर्ष में भुगतान किया जाने वाला शुल्क रु 4,100/- है।

विश्वविद्यालय अपने सभी कार्यक्रमों के लिए क्रेडिट प्रणाली का अनुसरण करता है। एक क्रेडिट शिक्षार्थी के अध्ययन के समय के 30 घंटे के बराबर है। एक अनुशासन में बीए (ऑनर्स) की डिग्री हासिल करने के लिए, एक शिक्षार्थी को न्यूनतम छह सेमेस्टर (तीन वर्ष) में 148 क्रेडिट के पाठ्यक्रम पूरा करना होता है। छात्रों को पहले और दूसरे सेमेस्टर में प्रत्येक में 22 क्रेडिट पूरा करना है, तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर में 28 क्रेडिट और पांचवें और छठे सेमेस्टर में प्रत्येक में 24 क्रेडिट। ऑनर्स कार्यक्रमों में अंतरविषयी पाठ्यक्रमों का मिश्रण होता है। 148 क्रेडिट अर्जित करने के लिए, एक छात्र को निम्नलिखित श्रेणियों के पाठ्यक्रमों का अध्ययन करना होगा:

क) अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (सीसी)

ख) अनुशासन विशिष्ट ऐच्छिक (डीएसई)

ग) योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (एईसीसी)

घ) कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (एसईसी)

ड) सामान्य ऐच्छिक (जीई)

एक शिक्षार्थी निम्नलिखित विषयों में से किसी एक में बीए ऑनर्स कार्यक्रम चुन सकता है: अर्थशास्त्र, अंग्रेजी, हिंदी, इतिहास, राजनीतिविज्ञान, मनोविज्ञान, लोक प्रशासन और समाजशास्त्र। ऑनर्स कार्यक्रमों का अध्ययन भार प्रत्येक सेमेस्टर में भिन्न होता है। एक बार जब अनुशासन चुना जाता है, तो सीखने वाले को सभी सेमेस्टर में केवल उसी अनुशासन से पाठ्यक्रमों (क) अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम और (ख) विषय विशिष्ट वैकल्पिक पाठ्यक्रम लेने अनिवार्य है।

#### अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (सीसी)

कार्यक्रम में मुख्य पाठ्यक्रम अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम है। प्रत्येक अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम छह क्रेडिट का है। ये पाठ्यक्रम कार्यक्रम के आधे से अधिक कवर करते हैं, कार्यक्रम के 148 क्रेडिट में से 84 क्रेडिट (14 पाठ्यक्रम - 6 क्रेडिट है।)

#### कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (एसईसी)

कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (एसईसी) भी क्षमता वृद्धि पाठ्यक्रम है जो दैनिक जीवन के क्षेत्र में निर्धारित विशिष्ट कौशल का निर्माण करते हैं। इन्हें तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर में प्रस्तावित किया गया है। प्रत्येक कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम

#### (विषय विशिष्ट ऐच्छिक पाठ्यक्रम (डीएसई)

कार्यक्रम के पांचवें और छठे सेमेस्टर में विषय विशिष्ट ऐच्छिक पाठ्यक्रम (डीएसई) प्रस्तुत किये जा रहे हैं। 4 डीएसई अध्ययन के विषय या विषय के लिए विशिष्ट (या विशेष या उन्नत या सहायक) हैं और एक विस्तृत दायरा प्रदान करते हैं। वे 6 क्रेडिट प्रत्येक (6 पाठ्यक्रमग 4 क्रेडिट) के हैं और इस प्रकार सभी में 24 क्रेडिट होंगे।

### योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (एईसीसी)

योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (एईसीसी) चार-चार क्रेडिट के हैं। जैसा कि नाम से पता चलता है, सभी शिक्षार्थियों के लिए योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (एईसीसी) अनिवार्य है। दो एईसीसी पाठ्यक्रमों का अध्ययन छात्रों को करना है। पहले और दूसरे सेमेस्टर में एक-एक एईसीसी प्रस्तावित हैं। पहले दो सेमेस्टर प्रत्येक (2 पाठ्यक्रम - 4 क्रेडिट) में एक कोर्स के साथ, एईसीसी पाठ्यक्रम सभी में 8 क्रेडिट जोड़ देगा।

### कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (एसईसी)

कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (एसईसी) भी क्षमता वृद्धि पाठ्यक्रम है जो दैनिक जीवन के क्षेत्र में निर्धारित विशिष्ट कौशल का निर्माण करते हैं। इन्हें तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर में प्रस्तावित किया गया है। प्रत्येक कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (एसईसी) चार क्रेडिट का है।

### सामान्य ऐच्छिक (जीई)

सामान्य ऐच्छिक (जीई) अन्य प्रकार के ऐच्छिक हैं जो कार्यक्रम के पहले, दूसरे, तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर में उपलब्ध हैं। प्रत्येक पाठ्यक्रम में 6 क्रेडिट का कार्यभार है। ये पाठ्यक्रम प्रकृति में अंतर-अनुशासनात्मक हैं और रअन्य विषयों/विषयों के लिए एक जोखिम प्रदान करते हैं। पहले चार सेमेस्टर (4 पाठ्यक्रम 6 क्रेडिट) में से प्रत्येक में एक कोर्स के साथ, जीई सभी में 24 क्रेडिट के लिए आएगा।

प्रत्येक सेमेस्टर में, छात्रों को पाठ्यक्रमों की विभिन्न श्रेणियों से सभी पाठ्यक्रमों में चार पाठ्यक्रमों में चार पाठ्यक्रमों का अध्ययन करना होता है, जबकि तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर को छोड़कर जब पाठ्यक्रमों की संख्या 5 हो जाती है। जब किसी सी., डीएसई और जीई श्रेणियों के अंतर्गत पाठ्यक्रम प्रत्येक में छह क्रेडिट के होते हैं एईसीसी और एसईसी के तहत पाठ्यक्रम प्रत्येक 4 क्रेडिट है। जबकि चौदह सीसी को 6 सेमेस्टर में वितरित किया जाता है, 4 डीएसई केवल पांचवे और छठे सेमेस्टर में उपलब्ध है। प्रत्येक सेमेस्टर में सामान्य पूल में उपलब्ध कई एसईसी और जीई होंगे, जिनमें उन्हें पेशकश की जाती है। एक छात्र को कार्यक्रम के तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर के दौरान प्रत्येक चार सेमेस्टर और एक एसईसी में अध्ययन के लिए केवल एक जीई का विकल्प चुनना होता है। समय-समय पर विश्वविद्यालय पाठ्यक्रमों के मौजूदा पूल में नए एसईसी और ऐच्छिक (डीएसई और जीई) जोड़ रहा है।

पहले और दूसरे सेमेस्टर में अध्ययन भार प्रत्येक 22 क्रेडिट होगा और जबकि तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर में क्रेडिट लोड 28 क्रेडिट प्रत्येक के लिए बढ़ाया जाएगा, यह पांचवे और छठे सेमेस्टर में प्रत्येक 24 क्रेडिट तक नीचे आ जाएगा। इस प्रकार, कुल अध्ययन भार 148 क्रेडिट पर आ जाएगा। निम्नतालिका बीए ऑनर्स (हिंदी) के लिए उपलब्ध क्रेडिट लोड और सेमेस्टर-वार पाठ्यक्रमों के कोड और सारणी प्रस्तुत करती है:

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### 3.11 स्नातक उपाधि (ऑनर्स) संस्कृत (बीएएसकेएच)

#### मानविकी विद्यापीठ (एसओएच)

विश्वविद्यालय अन्य विषयों के अतिरिक्त बी.ए. संस्कृत में ऑनर्स उपाधि कार्यक्रम प्रदान कर रहा है। कार्यक्रम से संबंधित जानकारी निम्नवत है—

#### उद्देश्य:

स्नातक उपाधि संस्कृत— बी.ए. संस्कृत ऑनर्स कार्यक्रम एक व्यापक कार्यक्रम है। इस कार्यक्रम का कोड **BASKH** है। यह कार्यक्रम संस्कृत विषय के गहन अध्ययन पर आधारित कार्यक्रम है जिसमें संस्कृत के अतिरिक्त अन्य विषयों का अध्ययन भी प्रस्तावित है। इस कार्यक्रम में विभिन्न विद्यापीठों से अध्ययन के कई विषय और पाठ्यक्रम शामिल हैं। एक एकल अनुशासन (संस्कृत) कुछ अंतर अनुशासनात्मक और कौशल आधारित वैकल्पिक पाठ्यक्रमों से तैयार किए गए पाठ्यक्रमों की पर्याप्त संख्या के साथ बी.ए. संस्कृत (ऑनर्स) को उस विशिष्ट अनुशासन संस्कृत में गहन ज्ञान प्रदान करने हेतु निर्मित किया है। बी.ए. संस्कृत (ऑनर्स) कार्यक्रम के सामान्य उद्देश्य निम्नरूपेण हैं —

- संस्कृत प्राचीनतम भाषा है, अतः संस्कृत व्याकरण संस्कृत वैदिक और लौकिक साहित्य में निहित ज्ञान परंपरा का परिचय, सम्प्रेषण और विस्तार करना।
- संस्कृत साहित्य के अध्ययन के माध्यम से भारतीय संस्कृति में निहित विविध ज्ञान परंपरा से छात्रों को परिचित करवाना।
- मुख्य विषय, अनुशासन केंद्रित ऐच्छिक, कौशल वृद्धि तथा सामान्य पाठ्यक्रमों के माध्यम से संस्कृत के अनुशासन में मुख्य विषयों के अतिरिक्त संबंधित विषयों का शिक्षार्थियों को बोध करवाना।
- स्नातक स्तर पर सत्रीय कार्य और अभ्यास के माध्यम से शिक्षार्थियों को पढ़ने और लिखने के कौशल से परिचित कराना।
- शिक्षार्थियों को संस्कृत विषय के अतिरिक्त अन्य विषयों के अध्ययन की ओर प्रेरित करने हेतु विषयों को अंतःविषयी अध्ययन के लिए प्रेरित करना।

**पात्रता:** 10+2 किसी मान्यता प्राप्त संस्थान

**शिक्षाकामाध्यम:** हिंदी

**अवधि:** न्यूनतम 3 वर्ष तथा अधिकतम 6 वर्ष, जनवरी और जुलाई दोनों प्रवेश सत्रों में प्रस्तावित।

**शुल्क संरचना:** पूरे कार्यक्रम के लिए 11,700/- एवं 3,900 प्रति वर्ष और पंजीकरण शुल्क 200/- अतिरिक्त देय होगा (पंजीकरण शुल्क केवल प्रथम वर्ष में देना होगा)।

विश्वविद्यालय अपने सभी कार्यक्रमों के लिए क्रेडिट प्रणाली का अनुसरण करता है। 01 क्रेडिट शिक्षार्थी के अध्ययन के समय के 30 घंटे के बराबर है। 01 क्रेडिट में निर्धारित 30 घंटे का अभिप्राय केवल मात्र लिखित सामग्री का अध्ययन करना ही नहीं है अपितु इसमें दृश्य—श्रव्य सामग्री के अध्ययन में व्यतीत होन वाले घंटे टेलीकॉन्फ्रेंस, टेलीकम्युनिकेशन और असाइनमेंट में व्यतीत किया जाने वाला समय भी इसमें शामिल होगा उदाहरण के लिए ज्ञानवाणी, ज्ञानदर्शन, स्वयंप्रभा स्वयं, ज्ञानकोश इत्यादि में व्यतीत होन वाला समय भी इन घंटों में समाहित होगा। छात्रों को चार क्रेडिट के पाठ्यक्रम के लिए 120 घंटे और 6 क्रेडिट के पाठ्यक्रम के लिए 180 घंटे अध्ययन की आवश्यकता है। एक अनुशासन में बी.ए. संस्कृत (ऑनर्स) की डिग्री प्राप्त करने के लिए एक अधिगमकर्ता को 6 सेमेस्टर में (3 वर्ष में) 148 क्रेडिट के पाठ्यक्रमों को पूरा करना होता है। छात्रों को पहले और दूसरे सेमेस्टर प्रत्येक में 22 क्रेडिट, तीसरे और चौथे प्रत्येक सेमेस्टर में 28 क्रेडिट तथा पाँचवें और छठे सेमेस्टर प्रत्येक में 24 क्रेडिट पूरे करने होंगे। ऑनर्स कार्यक्रमों में अंतर विषय पाठ्यक्रमों का मिश्रण होता है। 148 क्रेडिट अर्जित करने के लिए छात्र को निम्नलिखित श्रेणियों के पाठ्यक्रमों का अध्ययन करना होगा —

- क) अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (सीसी)  
 ख) अनुशासन विशिष्ट ऐच्छिक (डीएसई)  
 ग) योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (ईसीसी)  
 घ) कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (एसईसी)  
 ङ) सामान्य ऐच्छिक (जीई)

#### अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (Core Courses CC)

कार्यक्रम में मुख्य पाठ्यक्रम अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम है। प्रत्येक अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम 6 क्रेडिट का है। अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रमों की इस श्रेणी में 14 पाठ्यक्रम हैं। यह अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम सम्पूर्ण कार्यक्रम के आधे से अधिक भाग को समेट लेते हैं संपूर्ण कार्यक्रम के 148 क्रेडिट में से 84 क्रेडिट  $14 \times 6 = 84$  क्रेडिट इनके लिए हैं।

#### अनुशासन विशिष्ट ऐच्छिक पाठ्यक्रम (Discipline Specific Electives DSE)

विषय विशिष्ट ऐच्छिक पाठ्यक्रम कार्यक्रम के पांचवे और छठे सेमेस्टर में विषय विशेष शैक्षिक पाठ्यक्रम प्रस्तुत किए जा रहे हैं। यह पाठ्यक्रम प्रत्येक 6 क्रेडिट का है, दो पाठ्यक्रमों का पाँचवे सेमेस्टर में और दो पाठ्यक्रम का छठे सेमेस्टर में अध्ययन करना है इस प्रकार यह 24 क्रेडिट के पाठ्यक्रम होंगे।

#### कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (Skill Enhancement Courses SEC)

कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम भी अधिगमकर्ताओं की क्षमताओं में वृद्धि हेतु प्रस्तुत किए हैं जो दैनिक जीवन में निर्धारित विशिष्ट कौशल में निपुण करते हैं कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर में अध्ययन करना होगा कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम तृतीय सेमेस्टर में एक पाठ्यक्रम इसी प्रकार चतुर्थ सेमेस्टर में भी एक ही पाठ्यक्रम का अध्ययन करना होगा प्रत्येक पाठ्यक्रम 4 क्रेडिट का है इस प्रकार यह पाठ्यक्रम 8 क्रेडिट किए होंगे

#### योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses AECC)

योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रमका शिक्षार्थियों को प्रथम और द्वितीय सेमेस्टर में अध्ययन करना होगा यह पाठ्यक्रम चार क्रेडिट का होगा इस प्रकार यह पाठ्यक्रम 8 क्रेडिट के होंगे जैसा कि नाम से ही स्पष्ट है कि शिक्षार्थियों की योग्यता संवर्धन हेतु इन पाठ्यक्रमों को प्रस्तुत कार्यक्रम में स्थान दिया गया है

#### सामान्य ऐच्छिक पाठ्यक्रम (Generic Electives GE)

सामान्य ऐच्छिक अन्य प्रकार के ऐच्छिक पाठ्यक्रम है जो प्रथम द्वितीय तृतीय और चतुर्थ सेमेस्टर में अधिगमकर्ताओं के लिए उपलब्ध होंगे। प्रत्येक पाठ्यक्रम 6 क्रेडिट का होगा। इन पाठ्यक्रमों की प्रकृति अंतर अनुशासनात्मक हैं और अन्य विषय के लिए उपलब्ध होंगे अर्थात् बी. ए. संस्कृत ऑनर्स के शिक्षार्थियों से इतर विषयों के शिक्षार्थियों के लिए यह सामान्य ऐच्छिक पाठ्यक्रम प्रस्तावित है

बी.ए. संस्कृत ऑनर्स कार्यक्रम में 6 सेमेस्टर होंगे। पहले और दूसरे सेमेस्टर में अध्ययन भार प्रत्येक के लिए 22 क्रेडिट, तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर में अध्ययन भार प्रत्येक के लिए 28 क्रेडिट होगा पाँचवें और छठे सेमेस्टर में प्रत्येक के लिए अध्ययन भार 24 क्रेडिट होगा। इस प्रकार संपूर्ण कार्यक्रम 148 क्रेडिट का होगा। छात्रों के लिए 1,2,5 और 6 प्रत्येक सेमेस्टर में 4 पाठ्यक्रम अध्ययन के विषय होंगे जबकि तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर प्रत्येक में 5 पाठ्यक्रम अध्ययन के लिए प्रस्तावित होंगे। योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम और कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम प्रत्येक चार क्रेडिट के होंगे इनके अतिरिक्त सभी पाठ्यक्रम 6 क्रेडिट के होंगे।

### 3.12 Bachelor of Performing Arts – Hindustani Music (Honours)(BAPFHMH) School of Performing and Visual Arts (SOPVA)

B.A. (Performing Arts) – Hindustani Music Hons. (BAPFHMH) programme in Open & Distance Learning mode is an opportunity to large segment of the population including the disadvantaged to pursue a programme in Hindustani classical Music. The programme aims to provide Classical music education to the discerning students who do not have access to study it through conventional system. This course has been designed for serious students of music to get knowledge of the subject theoretically as well as practically. The programme objectives are to provide learners with learning experiences that help instill deep interests in learning Hindustani Classical music prevalent in the major part of Indian continent and develop broad and balanced knowledge and understanding of core components like: musical elements, principles, history of music, contributions of various musicologists throughout the ages, music education, and Aesthetics theories related to Hindustani Classical Music. The programme will also provide opportunities to the students to collaborate with fellow students and put up a joint stage production which will be a unique experience for the students of Performing Arts.

**Objectives:** The B.A. (Performing Arts) – Hindustani Music Hons.) Is designed to give an in-depth knowledge in the discipline of Hindustani Classical Music while allowing for exposure to subjects beyond the discipline as well. The programme is appropriate for ODL as it focuses on the skill and competences development having both professional and academic proficiency leading to job opportunities and over all development. The Honours programme has the following general objectives:

1. To introduce the learner to main themes and topics in the discipline of Hindustani Classical Music through core, discipline-centric electives, ability / skill enhancement and generic courses.
2. To facilitate the learners to work towards ability and skill enhancement through exposure to appropriate courses in humanities and social sciences.
3. Introduce learners to reading and writing skills through assignments and exercises at an undergraduate level.
4. Expose the learners to the importance of interdisciplinary study by enabling them to offer courses outside their disciplines.

**Learning Outcomes:** By undergoing this programme, the learner will: -

- Earn the proficiency to sing the prescribed Ragas with correct voice production.
- Be able to demonstrate the prescribed Talas.
- Be capable to express their understanding of evolution of Indian Classical Music
- Be able to understand and elaborate the historical development of Hindustani Music.
- Gain knowledge about the treatises of music written through the ages.
- Earn proficiency to collaborate with fellow artists to put up a group stage show.
- Develop pedagogical understanding of the subject to get employed in teaching jobs

**Eligibility:** 10+2

**Desirable:** Studied music as one of the subject in 11th and 12th Class / who have learned music from an institution or a guru.

**Medium of Instruction:** Hindi

(Although the SLM will be given in Hindi students will be allowed to write their assignments and exams in English too.)

**Duration:** Minimum 3 years and Maximum 6 years; offered only in July cycle of admission.

**Fee Structure:** A total of Rs. 27,600/- is to be paid year-wise for the full programme, @ Rs.9,200/year. Fee to be paid in the first year including a registration fee of 200/- is Rs.9,400/-.

The University follows the credit system for offering all its programmes. One credit is equal to 30 hours of learners' study time. To earn BA (Honours) Degree in a discipline, a learner has to complete courses worth 148 credits in a minimum of six semesters (three years). The students have to complete 22 credits each in first and second semesters; 28 credits each in third and fourth semesters; and 24 credits each in fifth and sixth semesters.

The Honours programmes have a mix of courses. For earning 148 credits, a student has to study the following

categories of courses:

- a) Core Courses (CC)
- b) Discipline Specific Electives (DSE)
- c) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)
- d) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)
- e) Generic Electives (GE)

A learner can choose BA Honours programme in any ONE of the following Disciplines: Economics, English, Hindi, History, Political Science, Psychology, Public Administration, Sociology and Hindustani Music. The study load of the Honours programmes varies from semester to semester. Once the Discipline is chosen, the learner has to take the courses under categories (a) Core Courses and (b) Discipline Specific Elective Courses from that Discipline ONLY in all the semesters.

### Core Courses (CC)

The programme has 14 core courses. Each core course is of six credits. These courses cover more than half of the programme, 84 credits (14 courses x 6 credits) out of 148 credits of the programme.

### Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSE)

Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSEs) are on offer in the fifth and sixth semesters of the programme. The 4 DSEs are specific (or specialized or advanced or supportive) to the discipline or subject of study and provide an extended scope. They are of 6 credits each (6 courses x 4 credits) and will thus be 24 credits in all.

### Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses are of four credits each. As the name suggests, the Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECCs) are compulsory for all learners. There are two AECCs on offer, one each in the first and second semesters. The AECC courses will add up to 8 credits in all.

### Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) are also ability enhancement courses. These are value-based and/or skill based courses and are designed to develop competencies and skills. Each Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) is of four credits. These courses are on offer in the third and fourth semesters. One SEC in each semester (2 courses x 4 credits) will add up to 8 credits.

### Generic Electives (GE)

Generic Electives (GEs) are the other type of electives that are on offer in the first, second, third and fourth semesters of the programme and are of 6 credits each. These courses are inter-disciplinary in nature and provide an exposure to other disciplines/ subjects. With one course in each of the first four semesters, (4 courses x 6 credits), GE will come to 24 credits in all.

### SEMESTER WISE COURSES

In each semester, the students have to study four 4 courses in all from different categories of courses except in the third and fourth semesters when the number of courses goes up to 5. While the courses under CC, DSE and GE Categories are of 6 credits each, the courses under AECC and SEC are of 4 credits each. While the fourteen CCs are distributed across the six semesters, the four DSEs are available in the fifth and sixth semesters only. There will be a number of SECs and the GEs available in the common pool in each of the semesters in which they are offered. A student has to opt for only one GE for study in each of the first four semesters and one SEC during the third and fourth semesters of the programme. The university will be adding new SECs and electives (DSEs and GEs) to the existing pool of courses from time to time. The study load in the first and second semesters will be 22 credits each and while the credit load in the third and fourth semesters will be enhanced to 28 credits each, it will come down to 24 credits each in the fifth and sixth semesters. Thus the total study load will come to 148 credits. The following Table presents the CODES and TITLES of credit load and semester-wise courses available for BA (Performing Arts) Hindustani Music Honours.
